That Does Compute: Steps to Success in Graduate School

Making the transition from HBCU to graduate school at a PWI (predominantly white institution) can be challenging, but research shows that students can achieve success with support and inspiration from campus organizations, fellow students, and mentors. In this presentation, Jeff Harlig will cover the ways students can get the most out of their graduate school career, using the example of IU Bloomington's network of cultural centers, student professional organizations, and support groups.

Jeff Harlig is an associate faculty member and the diversity coordinator in the Indiana University School of Social Work. He is interested in the uses of personality theory and student development theory in diversity education. In addition to his work at IU, Jeff offers diversity training for public schools, universities, hospitals and businesses. At the local level, he serves as chair of the city of Bloomington's Human Rights Commission, and at the national level works to promote minority language rights through the American Association for Applied Linguistics. He has a Ph.D. in linguistics from the University of Chicago.
